


Question 1

Overall, how would you rate the quality of the class materials for Evidence?






Compared to other YLS classes, how much out-of-class preparation, reading, and writing does Evidence require?

How would you rate the professor(s)'s management of class discussions?





Overall, how would you rate the professor(s)'s responsiveness to student comments, questions and concerns?



How would you rate the professor(s)'s availability to students outside of class?






Compared to other YLS classes, how valuable was in-class time in Evidence?

Professor Stein is a very nice person and a good teacher, and the material was interesting. To be honest, Professor Stein should have required more of the students--either by employing a panel system or cold-calling-because there were certainly times where no one spoke (creating awkward silences). I personally really liked when Professor Stein lectured, and think the class would be fine as almost a pure lecture-style course. The exam was very fair, though it should have just been self-scheduled (as opposed to the bizarre decision to make it scheduled, but allowing students to request changes for almost any reason).
